

PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

The Slam is designed primarily to offer more cricket for more people and as such the Women's Slam is deliberately pitched to be more akin to an entrylevel competition for hard ball cricket in Kent.

To ensure that the appropriate standard of player is participating in each element of The Slam there are clear rules in place that decree an individual's eligibility based upon the level of WEEKEND league cricket they play. In order to correctly assess this, it is vital that clubs use a SINGLE identity for each player on PlayCricket, even if that player is a member of multiple clubs. Where a concern is raised against the eligibility of a player, if their main PlayCricket ID is not utilised, it will not aid the team's case when assessing any possible rule infringement.



PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

The eligibility levels for the Kent Slam Women's competition is as follows:

Selected for Senior Regional Centre of Excellence	Ineligible	Ineligible

Played in Women's Cricket Southern League	Ineligible	Ineligible

Played >3 games in Kent / Sussex Women's Prem.	Ineligible	Ineligible

In future years a player's eligibility may be judged against different parameters, however with 2023 being the first year of the expanded version of this competition this will be the starting point and teams are entrusted to adhere to this.

Given the ethos and objectives of The Slam, any wilful abuse of this trust will only be serving to harm the future of the competition and as such shall not be looked upon favourably both now and in the future.

THE EXAMPLAYER EXEMPTIONS Out 2018

Naturally there are some players that will have played a mere handful of matches for a higherlevel team at a weekend, often by helping their club out at times of low availability. It isn't appropriate that any such player should be excluded or restricted when their true capability doesn't warrant it. For that reason, The Slam utilises an exemption process so that any such players can be clearly freed from any restrictions that their PlayCricket record would otherwise dictate. Note that a player shall not be exempted from ANY player eligibility rule unless the exemption process has been followed, a team does not have the right to decide who is exempt.

Similarly, it is recognised that a player may play at a level that automatically warrants restriction, but they may only excel in one facet of the game. As such a team may seek an exemption from the batting restriction for a bowler with little batting pedigree or seek an exemption from the bowling restriction for a batter with little bowling pedigree.



For whatever reason an exemption is sought, the online form found at

https://www.slamcricket.co.uk/kent-womensexemptions should be completed in full. Following this submission, a decision shall be made based on an assessment of the case made and the evidence available on PlayCricket. The outcome of EVERY request shall be published on that competition's Player Eligibility page on The Slam website.

It is advised that exemptions are submitted as far in advance of a match as possible, but at least 48 hours before, and that notification of the decision is not on the website or received in writing from The Slam then it should be assumed that individual has NOT been granted any form of exemption.



EXEMPTION EXAMPLES

EXEMPTION FROM BEING INELIGIBLE TO PLAY IN THE SLAM

J Smith has played more than 3 matches for Bexley's 1st XI but mainly due to unavailability and their participation has been limited to batting low down the order and bowling infrequently with minimal success.

An exemption request is submitted to enable her to be free of KT-WPE.3d because Bexley's 1st XI play in the Kent Women's Cricket League Premier Division, players from which are ineligible to play any part in The Slam if they have played more than 3 times.

The Slam makes a judgement that J Smith is materially not a 1st XI player and as such J Smith is free to play a full part in The Slam.
