to today's culmination of the Surrey Slam Men's Cup & Shield competitions at Valley End Cricket Club



This season has seen a record 109 men's teams, play out what will be 340 fixtures and within the region of 2,500 players involved. That's some way from the 13 teams in the southwest of the county 10 years ago.

This is the 8th year of The Surrey Slam as we know it now and this year certainly hasn't been without its challenges including as we've sought to integrate the new Surrey-wide Saturday league structure with the eligibility rules, which are so key. I think there may well need to be some tweaks for 2026 to ensure that the playing level for the both the Cup and the Shield remains appropriate. In addition to that, I do now wonder whether the time is right for a third tier!

The Slam's objective remains to offer more cricket for more people and whilst the level of competition is great to see I am mindful of the need for a competition that truly offers a comfortable environment for someone to find their way back into the game or provides that first transitional step from junior to senior cricket. There will be more to come on this very soon and I'd welcome everyone's input.

My thanks to our wonderful hosts who are once again providing a fitting setting for the 6 exciting matches ahead today. I hope you will partake of their warm hospitality and enjoy the continual action across the two pitches.

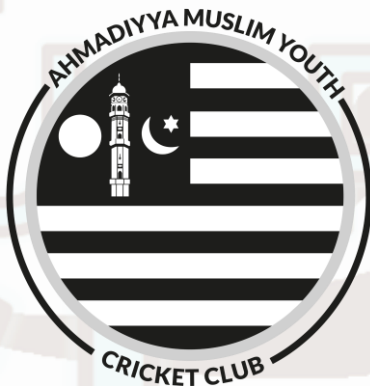

CUP RULES



On the whole, all the normal laws of cricket apply in The Slam, but there are a few tweaks to ensure that games tick along at a good pace, most notably:

- The first 10 overs are bowled from one end and the second 10 from the other. Only the batsmen will change ends at the end of each over other than before the 11th over;
- Bowlers are restricted to a maximum 10-yard run-up;
- For the first 6 overs, the fielding team must have 7 fielders, plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper in the inner fielding ring at the point of the ball being bowled. Thereafter they must have 4 fielders in. A no-ball shall be called if this is not the case;
- Any delivery passing untouched down the leg side is a wide, unless the batter moves inside the line of the ball after it leaves the bowler's hand;
- All illegal deliveries result in 2 runs and NO extra delivery being bowled, except for the final over of the innings where it is 2 runs AND an extra delivery;
- ANY no-ball results in a free hit on the next delivery;
- Batsman retire not out at 50 but can return after all other wickets are taken;
- Bowlers cannot bowl more than 4 overs;
- In the event of a tie (regardless of wickets lost) a super over will take place which will be decided by runs, then wickets, then boundaries over all 21 overs, then least extras, then bowl-out if necessary.

SHIELD RULES



On the whole, all the normal laws of cricket apply in The Slam, but there are a few tweaks to ensure that games tick along at a good pace, most notably:

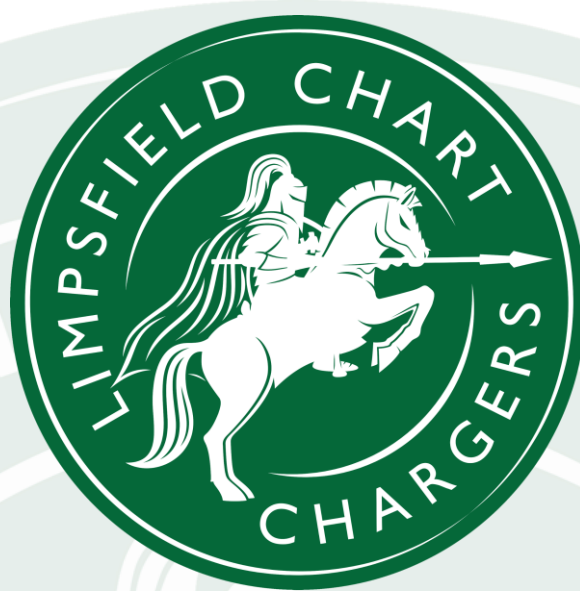
- The first 10 overs are bowled from one end and the second 10 from the other. Only the batsmen will change ends at the end of each over other than before the 11th over;
- Bowlers are restricted to a maximum 10-yard run-up;
- For the first 6 overs, the fielding team must have 7 fielders, plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper in the inner fielding ring at the point of the ball being bowled. Thereafter they must have 4 fielders in. A no-ball shall be called if this is not the case;
- Any delivery passing untouched down the leg side that is NOT within reasonable reach of the batter is a wide, unless the batter moves materially inside the line of the ball;
- All illegal deliveries result in 2 runs and NO extra delivery being bowled, except for the final over of the innings where it is 2 runs AND an extra delivery;
- ANY no-ball results in a free hit on the next delivery;
- Batsman retire not out at 50 but can return after all other wickets are taken;
- Bowlers cannot bowl more than 4 overs;
- In the event of a tie (regardless of wickets lost) a super over will take place which will be decided by runs, then wickets, then boundaries over all 21 overs, then least extras, then bowl-out if necessary.

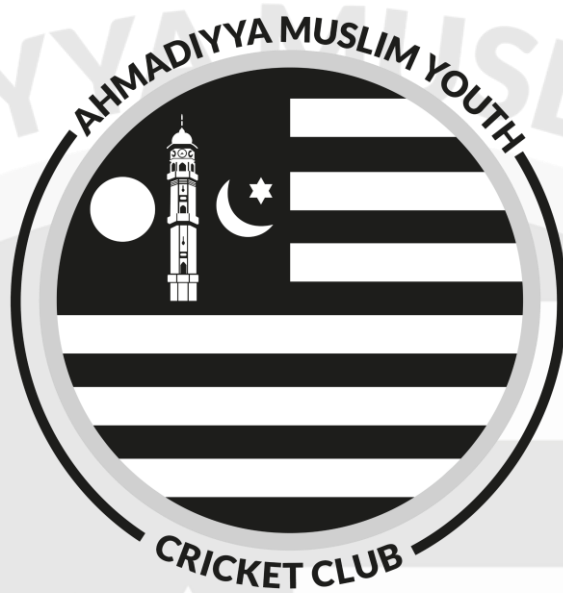
