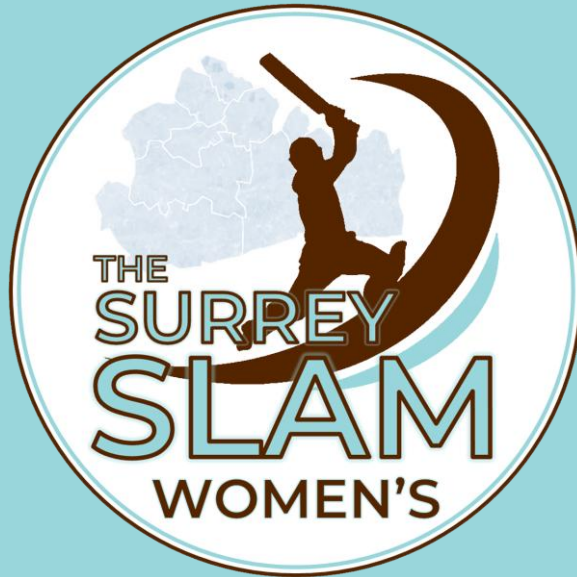

to today's culmination of the Surrey Slam Women's Cup & Shield competitions, for the first time at Valley End Cricket Club



This season has seen a record 30 women's teams, play out what will be 104 fixtures and within the region of nearly 600 players involved. That's some way from the 13 teams in our first season 6 years ago.

I've said it before about the women's and girls' game, but the standard continues to rise and it is vital that The Slam adapts to ensure that it still delivers against its primary objective, which is to provide more cricket for more people. To do that, we need to ensure that we are offering a true entry level option for hard ball cricket. The Surrey League is developing nicely, and Soft Ball provides a fantastic opportunity to get people into the game that otherwise might not do so. However, we need something that provides an appropriate environment to graduate players from one to the other. Please see more about how we intend to achieve that on the next page.

Turning to today's action, we are certain to crown a brand-new Shield champion today, and 3 out of the 4 teams in the Cup haven't lifted it before. PROPOSED NEW STRUCTURE

Being conscious of the commitment The Slam has to increase cricket participation, we have worked with Surrey Cricket Foundation to propose a change to the short-format structure.

The need for an appropriate bridge between soft and hard ball cricket is clear and we have operated a successful pairs competition in Sussex this year to try and achieve that. Add that to the fact that we have probably too much overlap between the Elite T20 and Slam Cup competitions, then the following proposal is to have the following three tiers.

THE RULES



Overall, all the normal laws of cricket apply in The Slam, but there are a few tweaks to ensure that games tick along at a good pace, most notably:

- The first 10 overs are bowled from one end and the second 10 from the other. Only the batters will change ends at the end of each over other than before the 11th over;
- Throughout the innings the fielding team must have 4 fielders, plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper in the inner fielding ring at the point of the ball being bowled.
- Teams will have 67 minutes from the start of their fielding innings to be in a position to commence the 20th over. If they are not then an additional fielder must be brought into the fielding ring.
- Any delivery passing untouched down the leg side that is NOT within reasonable reach of the batter is a wide, unless the batter moves materially inside the line of the ball;
- All illegal deliveries result in 2 runs and NO extra delivery being bowled, except for the final over of the innings where it is 2 runs AND an extra delivery up to a maximum of 9 balls in total;
- ANY no-ball results in a free hit on the next delivery;
- Batters retire not out the first time the ball is declared dead after the batter reaches or exceeds 40 runs, but can return after all other wickets are taken;
- Bowlers cannot bowl more than 5 overs;
- In the event of a tie (regardless of wickets lost) a super over will take place which will be decided by runs, then wickets, then boundaries over all 21 overs, then least extras, then bowl-out if necessary.
