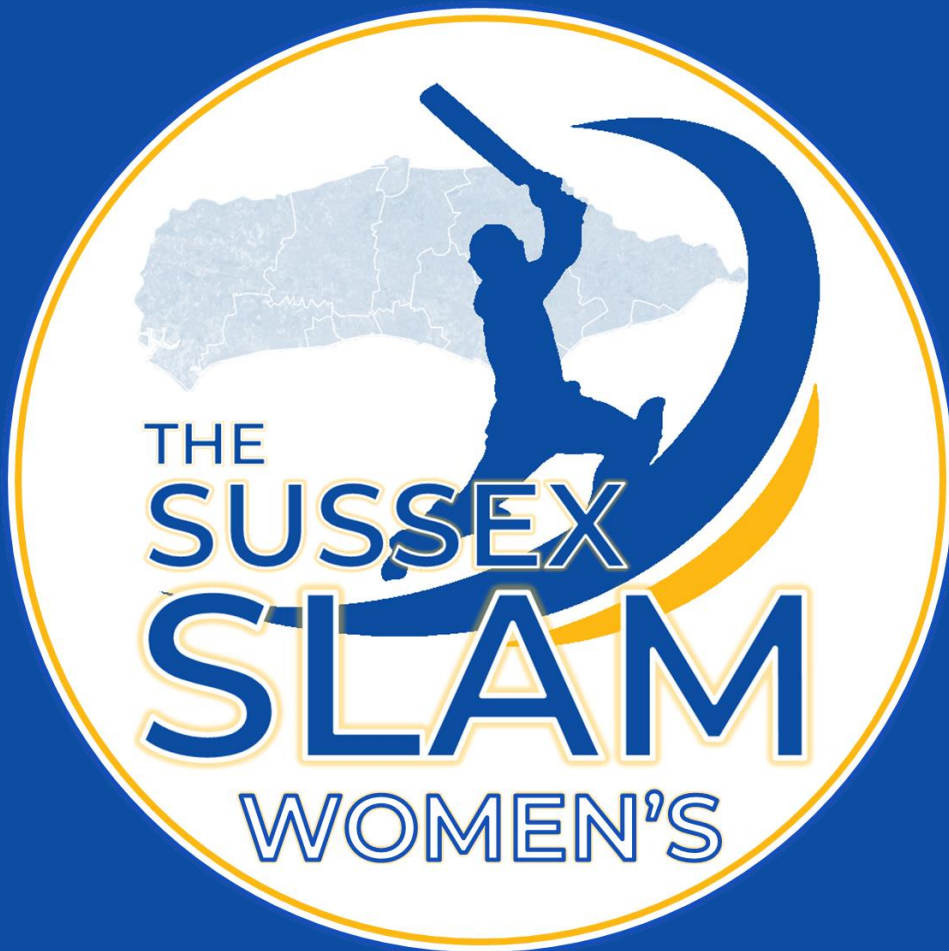

I hope you all enjoy the day,

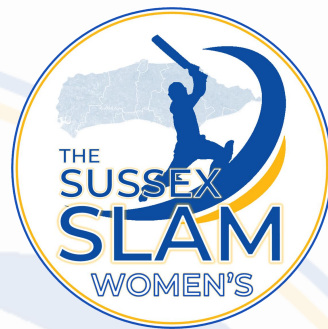

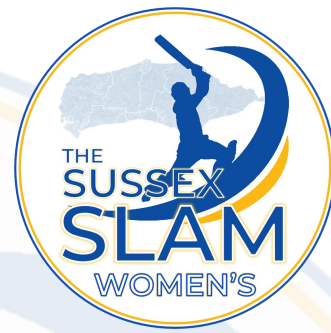

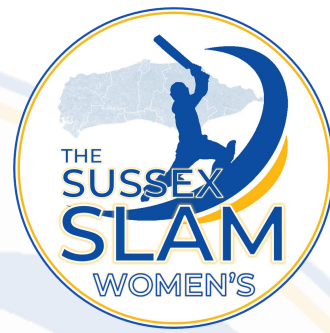
# THE RULES



On the whole, all the normal laws of cricket apply in The Women's Slam competition, but there are a few tweaks to ensure that games tick along at a good pace, most notably:

- The first 10 overs are bowled from one end and the second 10 from the other. Only the batter will change ends at the end of each over other than before the 11th over;
- The fielding team must have 3 fielders, plus the bowler and the wicketkeeper in the inner fielding ring at the point of the ball being bowled (4 fielders if more than 9-a-side). A no-ball shall be called if this is not the case;
- All illegal deliveries result in 2 runs and NO extra delivery being bowled, except for the final over of the innings where it is 2 runs AND an extra delivery;
- ANY no-ball results in a free hit on the next delivery;
- Batters retire not out at 40 but can return after all other wickets are taken;
- Only if not 11-a-side the same number of wickets as there are players in the side must be taken to be 'all out'. The last batter will be allowed to continue on their own and can only be run-out at the end they are running towards. If they run an odd number then they will return to the facing end once the ball is declared dead.
- In a 8 or 9-a-side match bowlers cannot bowl more than 5 overs each, in 11-a-side there is a maximum of 4 overs each.
- In the event of a tie in any match (regardless of wickets lost) a super over will take place which will be decided by runs, then wickets lost, then boundaries over all overs, then least extras, then bowl-out if necessary.

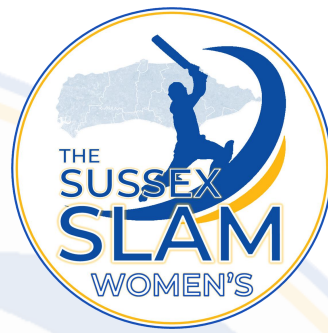

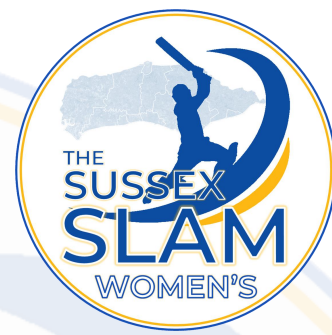

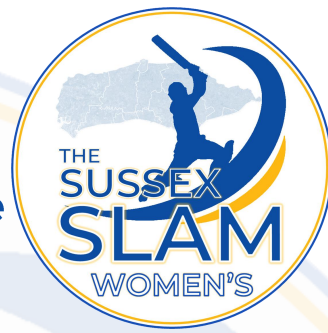
